# Logging In

1. Go to the Library's website at [udlibrary.org](http://udlibrary.org).
2. Choose eResources in the top menu bar & click "PowerLibrary: Magazine & News Article Searches".
3. If you're at home, put in your library barcode from a card with the blue Access PA logo on it.
4. Choose your Database:
  - For general magazine articles & research, click on **Newspapers/Magazines**, then **MasterFile Main Edition**.

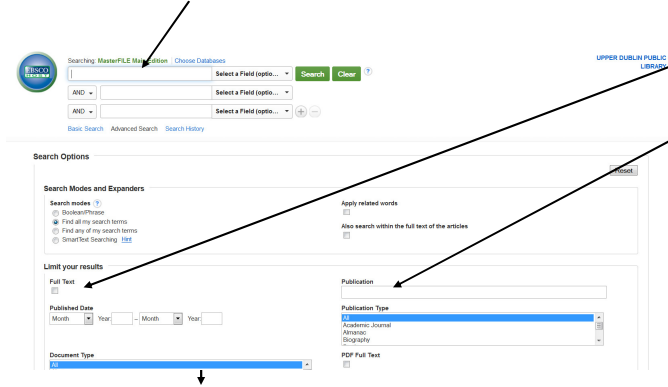

- For newspaper articles, click on **Newspapers/Magazine**, then **Newspaper Source Plus**.
- For business articles, click **Business**, then **Business Source Main Edition**
- For Automotive repair information, click on **Auto Repair**, then **Auto Repair Reference Center**.

# Creating a Basic Search

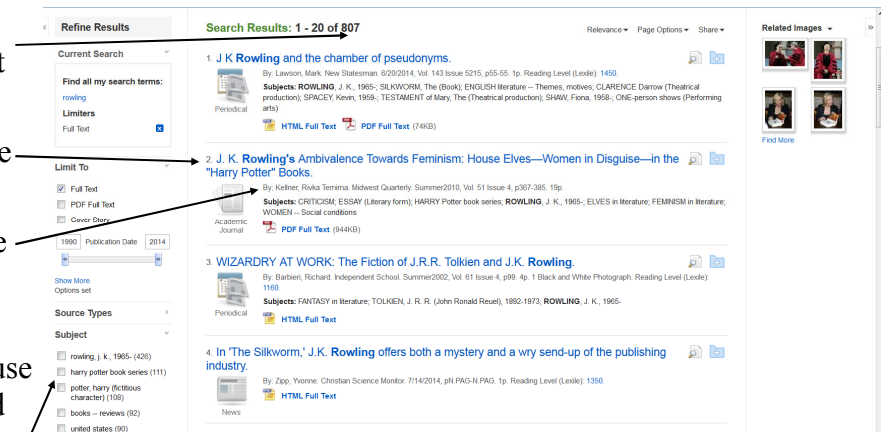
1. Enter your search terms in the main search box. More specific terms will give you better results, for example: painting vs. Picasso.



2. **IMPORTANT:** Check **Full Text** to get only those articles available immediately.
3. To search just one journal, fill in the **Publication** box with the Journal name. (Uncheck **Full Text** if you do this.)
4. To search a specific date range, click Fill in the **Published Date** fields.
5. Click **Search**.

# Using the Results

1. Note the number of items retrieved to make sure you don't need to narrow further.
2. To look at an article, click on the title of the article.
3. The original source of the article is listed beneath the title.
4. To print, email or save the document, open the article and use the menu items in the right-hand bar.



## To limit your search:

1. If you want to limit your search further (for example, this search has 807 results), you may choose a subject heading that matches what you are looking for.
2. Check the subject heading to limit your results (to check multiple subject headings, click **Show More**, click the desired headings and click **Update**).
