Our Identity

All are welcome to convene, collaborate, create...and connect at the Upper Dublin Library! Relocated to a state-of-the-art building in 2020 and designed to be Upper Dublin's center for community engagement, the award-winning UDPL is an inviting destination that connects visitors to books and other resources, to opportunities to learn and grow, and to each other. That's why our mission is:

Connecting people and ideas to educate, inspire and strengthen the Upper Dublin community.



Core Service 1: Staff

Whether looking to research family history, find a child's next favorite read, or get assistance with downloading free ebooks, we are ready to help! Available 7 days/65 hours/week, our friendly and knowledgeable staff are available to answer questions and provide direction with library services from multiple service points in the building as well as by phone and email.



Core Service 2: Collections

The emphasis of the UDPL's collections is on acquiring books and other materials for wide-ranging ages and interests and offering choice of subjects, perspectives, and formats. From the latest bestsellers to children's books at every reading level, library cardholders have free access to millions of books, movies, TV shows, audiobooks, and more.



Core Service 3: Spaces

We pride ourselves on providing comfortable and well-equipped spaces to study, meet, read, and play. The UDPL contains nine study rooms, multiple meeting rooms, an auditorium, cozy reading nooks, a preschool PlaySpace, and a computer lab. Plus we offer robust wifi, charging stations, and printing & scanning. Our spaces are designed for you!

2. Engaged Community

April 2023: Mailed surveys to 25% of randomly selected residences in Upper Dublin Township and opened online survey to the entire community.

May-June 2023: Led 9 Focus Group Discussions, including students in grades K-12 as well as those currently employed fulltime and those retired.

1. Formed Strategic Planning Committee

January 2023: Composed of Library Staff & Board Members

3. Analyzed Feedback

Summer 2023: Collected and categorized responses from surveys and focus groups.

4. Drafted Goals & Objectives

September 2023: Members of the Library Board & Leadership Staff participated in a half-day retreat to review the community feedback and formulate draft goals.

5. Shared Goals Internally

November-December 2023: Draft goals were shared with stakeholders, including Township Manager, Commissioners, Library Board, Friends of the Library, and staff.

6. Adopted Plan

January 17, 2024: Library Board Meeting

Connecting People & Ideas













Goal #1



Generations participate in rich, interactive learning opportunities that deepen their own understanding while inviting them to contribute to the collective learning experience of others.

Rationale

With Americans living longer, and social and economic changes having splintered traditional family structures, developing new opportunities for people to connect is vital. The benefits are endless—the ability to impart wisdom, build empathy, share similar interests, boost confidence, and find companionship. As an institution that welcomes people of all ages, the UDPL is uniquely positioned to nurture an environment ripe for fostering mutually-beneficial peer-to-peer and intergenerational relationships where all parties have something to contribute and gain.

The Work Ahead:

- Identify and develop new opportunities for learners to nurture their own curiosity and creativity, to collaborate, and to share their knowledge through hands-on activities at the UDPL and beyond.
- Transform the UDPL Creative Suite (UDPL STEAM Lab & Computer Lab) into an intergenerational community workspace that supports 21st-century learning.
- Evolve and enhance Adult Discovery & Learning to increase participation, reach new adults, and establish the UDPL as a center for lifelong learning.

Targeted Outcomes:

Improved knowledge and exposure to new ideas and resources; recognition for having shared meaningful information with others; involvement from multiple generations; increased visits & interactions with Library services & programs.







Readers of all ages discover books that enhance their literacy skills, expand their minds, and form the foundation for a lasting love of reading.

Rationale

Experts in education, science and medicine have clearly established that reading has a profound effect across generations. Young readers gain foundational learning and critical thinking skills while adults boost their memory and cognition health. For the youngest readers, it not only exposes them to advanced language skills, but shared reading with a trusted caregiver has the power to build lifelong bonds. Reading also expands our ability to interpret and analyze, and builds empathy and understanding. Reading can entertain, inspire and excite us, as well as help us relax and experience some relief from the stresses of every day life. With its vast resources, the UDPL is well-positioned to match people with books, authors, and reading experiences that inspire, educate, and satisfy them, personally and professionally.

The Work Ahead:

- Showcase library collections by optimizing opportunities for the community to share books, writers, and reading experiences.
- Develop and implement a plan to update & refresh library communications that highlight community reading & improve reader engagement.
- Develop library staff as book advocates and experts who will share their knowledge with each other and the community.

Targeted Outcomes:

Satisfaction with reading suggestions, improved reading skills, and, overall, greater delight in reading as a result of experiences with library collections, communications, and programs.







Our community comes together in a vibrant, accessible & inclusive Center for Community Engagement.

Rationale

Libraries are an essential part of the social infrastructure, critical to the health and wellbeing of our communities and a democratic society at large. By welcoming all people to convene, collaborate and create together, they provide the setting and context for social participation across generations. Reimagined as a Center for Community Engagement when it opened its new facility in 2020, the UDPL will continue to work towards this vision by growing its partnerships and exploring new opportunities to make the Library a destination where a sense of community is promoted and where everyone belongs.

The Work Ahead:

- Foster connections & dialogue, share resources, and enhance the cultural fabric of our community through partnerships with mission-aligned area organizations.
- Optimize the UDPL experience by developing plans for unfinished and underutilized indoor and outdoor public spaces.
- Identify barriers to accessing library services, and find solutions to reduce or remove them to ensure the UDPL is a welcoming place for everyone.

Targeted Outcomes:

Greater use of library meeting spaces; stronger & more collaborative partnerships; improved knowledge, exposure to new ideas and resources, and/or interest in taking an action; overall, increased visits & interactions with Library services & programs.
